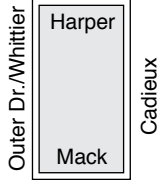

Lost pet reminders

Just want to emphasize the importance of registering your pets. In the past year since I have held the position of Lost Pets, there were 22 animals lost and only 10 were returned to their owner. Anti-Cruelty received three, Humane Society one, Pit bull Rescue one, four were unresolved, and two were given new homes.

There were also three cats found and one parakeet who found a new loving home. One of the found dogs was tethered in the front yard of the finder and it was stolen.

In addition two dogs were reported lost, and I was not notified if the owners got them back. Six were seen on the run in the neighborhood.

There was lots of activity in the past year, and that does not account for the ones of which I was not made aware. If an animal

Are you thinking of running for the EEV Board? Here's what each position does for East English Village.

PRESIDENT

- * Prepare agendas and conduct General Meetings and Board Meetings
- * Appoint committees and monitor, or delegate the monitoring of, the principal activities of these committees
- * Attend, or appoint a representative to attend, meetings of other neighborhood organizations and business associations as a representative of EEV
- * Arrange for speakers for the General Meetings
- * Report monthly at the General Meeting of the activities he/she has conducted or attended on behalf of the Association since the time of the previous report.

1ST VICE PRESIDENT

- * Perform all duties of the president in his/her absence.
- * Attend General Meetings and Operations Council meetings
- * Monitor committee activities as requested by the president
- * Assist the president in the scheduling of speakers for the General Meetings.

2ND VICE PRESIDENT

- * Perform all duties of the 1st Vice President in his/her absence.
- * Maintain all records of the Association except the financial accounts
- * Maintain the records of the Board and Block Captain network
- * Maintain list of occasional volunteers

TREASURER

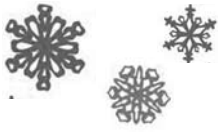
- * Maintain the financial records of the Association
- * Collect and dispense the Association's funds
- * Report on the finances of the Association at the General Meetings and Board meetings.
- * Arrange for an annual audit of the financial accounts
- * Arrange with a local bank to deposit the Association's funds and maintain a checking account for the transaction of the association's business
- * Disburse the Association's funds as approved by the Board

RECORDING SECRETARY

- * Record the minutes of each Board meeting
- * Provide the previous meeting minutes at each meeting
- * Maintain such records as are requested by the President and/or the Board Meeting
- * Pick up, or arrange to have collected, the Association's mail at the Post Office box at least on a weekly basis

STREET REPRESENTATIVES

- * Assure that each block on the street he/she represents has a block captain
- * Coordinate projects with the block captains as necessary
- * Any other duties deemed necessary by the Board

Residential code violations in EEV

DID YOU KNOW? Instead of assuming that our residents know what the municipal codes are that we should all be following, we will bring awareness to a code every month. This month is about maintenance.

Occupants of a dwelling unit are responsible for keeping that part of the dwelling unit or premises, which they occupy and control, in a clean, habitable, sanitary, and safe condition. This includes falling gutters, broken windows, etc. The city may inspect an owner-occupied structure and issue a correction order

for multiple violations. The occupant must make repairs in order to receive a certificate of compliance. FINE \$250

Grass and weeds should be maintained to a height less than eight inches by the owner or occupant of that property. This does not include flowers and gardens. Poisonous weeds are not permitted. FINE: \$50

Occupants who have an emergency condition at their residence, including sewage in basement, NO HEAT OR ELECTRICITY, falling porches, etc. can face a \$500 FINE.

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Post office closings

Southern Michigan could see 17 post office branches close this year, including our Kensington Station. The U.S. Postal Service provided a list of possible closures, coming on the heels of dire warnings that the Postal Service is going broke and must close one of every 10 post offices. The list includes 10 offices in Detroit alone, along with others in Ferndale, Highland Park, Pontiac and Flint.

The Postal Service hasn't received tax dollars since the early 1980s, he said. Before it can downsize, by law, it must hold community meetings in each area where a post office

could close so customers can give comments for Congress to consider before approving any closures, Moore said.

Detroit, in particular, has lost so many residents and businesses that its post offices are dinosaurs, officials said. Even if all 10 Detroit offices on the list were to close, there would still be 28 post offices in the city and its nearby Wayne County suburbs, officials said. The plan is to replace full-scale post offices with what are called expanded-access sites -- in drugstores, supermarkets and banks -- where postal patrons can purchase stamps,

mail packages and get most of the same services they're used to.

Mail volume has skidded 20% in the last five years. The Postal Service lost \$8 billion last year and is projected to

lose at least as much this year -- despite trimming 200,000 jobs in the last 10 years and slashing costs by \$12 billion in the last four years, according to postal officials.

Affordable home repair with grants and loans

You have the opportunity to be part of the restoration of Detroit, a comeback story that could be powerful enough to become a model for metropolitan revitalization. Like many great stories, this is one of coming together as a community. The City of Detroit, Mayor Dave Bing's Detroit Works Project and Citizens Bank are here to be a part in Detroit's rebirth. Through the "Commitment to Community Partnership," this program offers grants and loans to help you purchase a home or beautify your current home in Detroit.

If you own a home in EEV, you may qualify for a grant to restore, repair or beautify the exterior of your qualified home. This isn't free money. Like any partnership, you will have to pitch in and do your part. You may qualify to receive a matching grant of \$10,000 for approved work on a qualified home if you are willing to invest \$20,000. Invest less than \$20,000 and we will match 50% of what you contribute. To qualify for the matching grant, you must be able to prove that you live at your home, and are up to date on payment of taxes and insurance.

You may also qualify for a loan. Citizens Bank is offering unsecured home improvement loans from \$500 to \$10,000. They will waive the processing fee, and offer rates that are at least 1.5 percent below current market rates. Improvements to your home must comply with all local zoning

ordinances and building codes.

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
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
